2018 Keizai Koho Business Speaker Luncheon

On May 8, 2018, JASH was honored to feature Mr. Koji Nagashima, Executive Vice President of Aioi Nissay Dowa based in Tokyo, Japan. The event was made possible through a grant from the Keizai Koho speaker series that we received through the National Association of Japan-America Societies (NAJAS).
